Mobile Art Bus

A working group has been established to deliver Mobile Art Bus Workshops throughout the Rural City of Wangaratta. The first workshop was held on 16th November with Moyhu/Myrrhee Schools Out of School Hours Care students. It was a huge success! Jess Young, the community member that attended the RESPOND workshops, facilitated the session with funding, and the use of the bus, from Pangerang Neighbourhood House. Bunnings kindly collected and donated waste materials and Gateway Heath attended and helped coordinate the workshop. Recreation Reimagined Event

The Rural City of Wangaratta held 'Recreation Reimagined' on Thursday 19th October, 3-6pm at Apex Park. Representatives from local clubs showcased their offerings and were interactive in their displays, the aim of the event was for clubs to share their details and for the community to 'come and try'. Approximately 14 clubs/groups participated with each receiving a \$1,000 Active Wangaratta Grant from Council to help improve their membership base. The Hockey Club who had representatives attend the RESPOND workshop were keen to see an event like this held and it was great that the Hockey Club hosted a stall to promote their club.

Cooking Skills and Food Growing Spaces

A meeting was held in October with Respond participants that were interested in action ideas that support building skills and knowledge in both cooking (focus on affordable, nutritious, easy to make snacks/meals) and food growing. Several ideas were discussed and it was decided the group would focus on a potential cooking session with Outside School Hours Care and investigate some other ideas.

Cooking — we are hoping to develop a partnership with the Outside School Hours Care program at Whitfield Primary School, Pangerang Neighbourhood House (Mobile Hub) and several community members to run pilot cooking sessions in term 1 2024. We are planning to run some cooking sessions with other Outside School Hours Care programs in term 2, 2024. From the cooking sessions we would like to develop a resource that could be used by other Outside School Hours Care programs.

Cooking/Food growing – some background research into intergenerational cooking and gardening programs has been undertaken – with a focus on models where aged care services and schools work in partnership.

Food growing garden mapping - a garden mapping activity is being undertaken for early childhood services, schools, community and public places so that we have a clear picture of where food growing is happening in these settings across the Rural City of Wangaratta.

Active Travel to School

The Rural City of Wangaratta supported Appin Park Primary School to hold a Footpath Activation event on Monday 23rd October to launch large stickers placed on one of the foot paths leading into the school. Children had created pictures for the stickers in the school holidays at an activity held at the library. 36 children and adults enjoyed the event. Gateway Health came along on the day to support, it was a fantastic morning and such a nice way to start the day with a walk. The event was supported by funding from VicHealth.

The Council conducted a tally one month before the event to find that 5 children used the footpath during the time they observed and will return in December to conduct another tally to see how well used the footpath is and determine whether the stickers and event encouraged kids to continue to walk to school.

Accessibility for all Framework/Checklist for RESPOND Projects

A working group of community members has been established and have:

- 1. Reviewed existing accessible/inclusive event checklists that are used for planning purposes and the group is considering how these can be more widely used, including throughout RESPOND projects.
- 2. Identified a program that supports businesses/organisations with an assessment of how accessible and inclusive they are and rewards them with internationally recognised accessibility stickers that they can display. The program aims to encourage more accessible local spaces as well as create a broader awareness of accessibility needs. People with lived experience of disability are involved with the assessment and reward process. The group is identifying potential partnerships to see if they can get support to run a similar program in the Rural City of Wangaratta. Tiny Towns Fund

The new Tiny Towns Fund will support local communities to deliver quality tourism and community facility projects, such as splash parks and bike trails, playgrounds, community hall and library upgrades, public art and more. Towns with a population of up to 5,000 people in the 48 local government areas of regional Victoria are eligible to apply, as well as Alpine Resorts and Melbourne's 10 interface outer metropolitan local government areas.
