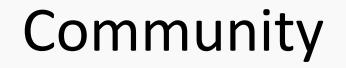


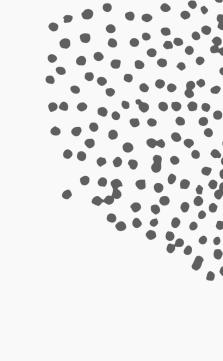


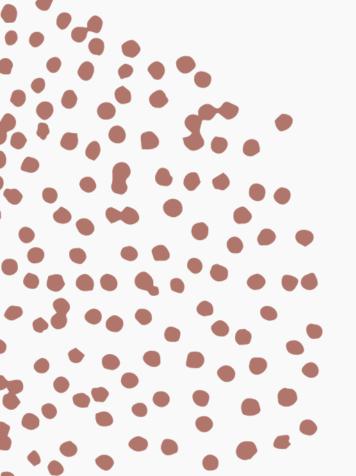
#### Welcoming Cities – Victoria



25 councils have become member councils of Welcoming Cities in Victoria, covering more than 52% of the state's population.









#### **Estimated Resident Population**






- Wodonga population growth rate is usually higher than of Regional VIC

#### Population age profile






- 52.6% of population in Wodonga is under 40 years old.


- 1.1% of the residents in Wodonga identify is either Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander or both.



### General educational attainment by place of birth, by sex






- Overseas born individuals are more likely to hold Bachelors Degree or higher than Australia born individuals.









- 0.8% or 339 individuals of the population report being homeless

#### Religious Affiliation








- 46% of individuals residing in Wodonga report their religion to be 'Christianity' and 44% report having 'Secular Beliefs and Other Spiritual Beliefs and No Religious Affiliation'.
- Individuals reporting all other religions represent over 3.5% of total population of Wodonga combined.

#### Volunteering





- 12% of residents of Wodonga report being a volunteer
- Women (especially OS-born women) report being a volunteer more often
- There has a significant decrease in volunteering, especially amongst AU-born female population (possibly due to the pandemic and volunteering fatigue).

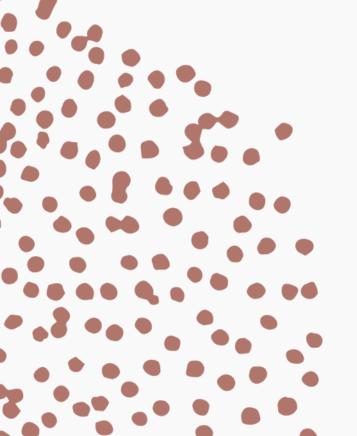



#### Unemployment rates 2011-2023






- Wodonga unemployment rates generally follow Victoria.

- Participation rate: 62.5%


Note: The chart reflects the proportions of all residents who answered Census questions about labour force status.

#### Total personal income, by place of birth, by sex






- Women are more likely to be on negative or nil income.


## Industry of Employment, 2016 vs 2021






- Strongest growth:
  - Construction (+31%)
  - Health Care and Social Assistance (+31%)
- Decline:
  - Information Media and Telecommunications (-12%)
  - Rental, Hiring and Real Estate (-11%)

#### Industry of employment by sex



- Women are almost 4 times more likely to work in Health Care and Social Assistance and 3 times more likely to work in Education and Training.
- Men are almost 10 times more likely to wok in Mining, 6 times more likely to work in Construction, 4 times more likely to work in Transport, Postal and Warehousing, Electricity, Gas, Water and Waste Services, and Manufacturing.

#### Industry of employment by place of birth



- Overseas-born individuals are more likely to work in:
  - Health Care and Social Services
  - Manufacturing
- Australia-born individuals are are more likely in every other industry.

#### Jobs and Internet Vacancies





As of 28th of May 2024 in Wodonga:

- The average pay for jobs is \$83K per year.
- Entry-level positions start at \$27K per year, while the most experienced workers can earn up to \$350K per year.
- 161 companies are currently advertising jobs including <u>The Just</u> <u>Group</u>, <u>Coles</u>, <u>Australian Broadcasting</u> <u>Corporation</u>, <u>Hays</u>, <u>Mars and</u> <u>Incorporated</u>.
- Top skills include: TEAM PLAYER, TRADING, CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT, MANAGEMENT and LEADERSHIP.



- Implement welcoming workplaces practice to retain diverse workforce

- Skills shortage may impact the quality of life in the city and drive people to leave the area
- The shortage of in language services may impact the levels of participation from CALD community and be a driving force for them to leave for a metropolitan area.
